
YSGA has had a great start to the new year! Students enjoyed their winter break and everyone was excited to return to school to see their friends and teachers.

- Exercise & Eat Healthy Being physically active (30-60 minutes of activity a day) and healthy eating are important for overall heart health.
- Maintain a healthy weight.
- Get good quality sleep.
- Manage stress.
- Get regular health screenings.







School Choice WEEK

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



Hello everyone! Can you believe we are halfway through the school year already? The next big item on our academic agenda here at Young Scholars is the PSSA test.

Impressionism:

Students were asked to create an impressionistic watercolor painting in the style of Claude Monet. The younger grades worked on something similar to Monet's Water lilies while the upper grades created impressionistic landscapes focusing on color and brush strokes.

Realistic Shading:

Students were introduced to grayscale and created a shaded sphere by placing a lightsource in one corner of their paper. Students used blending techniques to create smove shadows and erasers to create highlights in their pictures.
