

Our 6th graders have really taken a deep dive into Earth science and have been exploring the Earth's layers, plate tectonics, and how landforms change over time.


Our 7th graders, recently explore cells and are starting to explore the human body and its systems. We are looking forward to ending this unit with our first frog dissection.


8th graders have been learning about the periodic table, pure substances, and mixtures. They have developed test to determine the difference between pure substances and mixtures based on their physical and chemical properties.
